

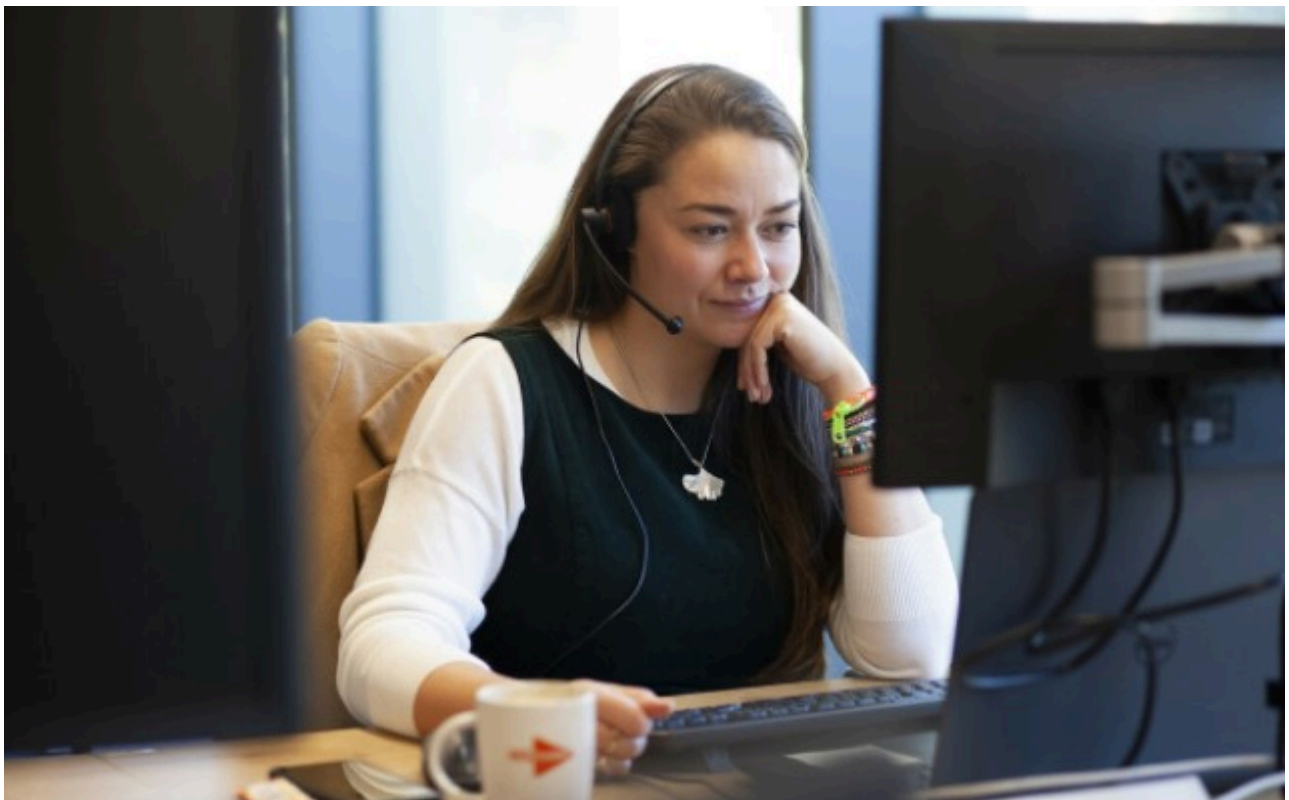

### MS-STAT2 trials results

The trial shows that simvastatin is not an effective treatment for secondary progressive MS.

The results of the MS-STAT2 trial were announced by Professor Jeremy Chataway at theECTRIMS research conference in Copenhagen.

### HERCULES trial: Tolebrutinib shows promise for non-active SPMS

For the first time, a phase 3 trial has shown a drug can slow down disability progression in people with secondary progressive MS who don't have relapses. In two other phase 3 trials, tolebrutinib also slowed progression in relapsing MS.
